Program Mission Statement

The Radiologic Technologies Program has specific admission requirements. Admission to the college does not guarantee acceptance into the Radiologic Technologies Program.

Program Requirements:

1. Submit an Admissions Application and forward all high school as well as other college transcripts directly to the Office of Admissions and Registration.

2. Submit the Radiologic Technology Program Admission Application form to the Department by mail or in person at Room 4453 no later than March 1st prior to the Summer Semester wishing admission.
3. Admission to the Radiologic Technology Program will be determined by a ranking of the grade point average (GPA) of the program prerequisite courses only and residency status. No student will be considered for admission to the Radiologic Technology Program unless they have received at least a grade of "C" in all the program prerequisites and minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5.
